Dear Mr. Ventresca,

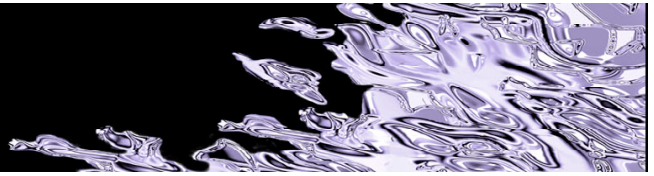
